

COVID-19 Test Options

Many health insurance plans cover COVID-19 tests without a copay, coinsurance, or deductible for persons with symptoms of COVID-19. Locations throughout the state offer COVID-19 tests, including hospitals, pharmacies, primary care offices, urgent care centers.

Tests for active COVID-19 disease are available in locations across New Hampshire and include both the polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test and the rapid antigen test.

Persons who do not have insurance or have a health insurance plan that does not fully cover the cost of COVID-19 testing, vaccine administration, and treatment may also have these services paid for by the New Hampshire Medicaid COVID-19 Group. At-Home Testing Options

Free Vault At-Home PCR Test	https://learn.vaulthealth.com/nh/	Each resident can order 1 test at a time. Once results are provided by lab, another test can be ordered.
Free Federal At-Home Rapid Antigen Tests	https://www.covidtests.gov	Every home in the US is eligible to order 4 free at-home rapid tests.
For those with private insurance:	https://www.cms.gov/how-to-get-your-at-home-OTC-COVID-19-test-for-free	You can purchase over-the-counter COVID-19 rapid antigen tests for reimbursement or, depending on plan coverage, some tests may be free at point of sale.
For those with Medicaid:	Tests are available for no costs at pharmacies for Medicaid beneficiaries. Take the at-home tests to the pharmacy counter and ask for the tests to be billed to Medicaid. Information about how pharmacies can bill Medicaid has been sent to all pharmacies.	Each beneficiary can get up to 8 free rapid antigen tests a month through a Medicaid-enrolled pharmacy.
For those who are uninsured:	Tests are available at no costs from pharmacies for persons who are enrolled in the Medicaid COVID-19 Group. Uninsured persons can go to nheasy.nh.gov to enroll. Take the at-home tests to the pharmacy counter and ask for the tests to be billed to Medicaid. Information about how pharmacies can bill Medicaid has been sent to all pharmacies.	Each beneficiary signed up for the COVID-19 Group on NH Easy can get up to 8 free rapid antigen tests a month through a Medicaid-enrolled pharmacy.
